Managing Curator Statement

Bavor holds a Bachelors degree in art history from Northwestern University and a Masters degree from the University of Nebraska, Lincoln in the History of Textiles/Quilt Studies emphasis. Her Masters thesis explored the origins and development of the art quilt in California. Bavor is currently Acting Director of the San Jose Museum of Quilts and Textiles, in San Jose, California.
